bemoaning his lot. Then one of his friends suggested to him, "You have two choices. You can get busy living or you can get busy dying. Make your choice." He said he began to realize that that was not only good advice for him at that particular time in his life, but for all of us in general – in our spiritual lives as well as in our physical. Prayer Chain

I was curiously exploring the internet today and wondered about the definition of “chain”. The first one listed was “a connected, flexible series of links, typically of metal, used especially for holding objects together or restraining or for transmitting mechanical power” and further on as “a series of closely linked or connected things.”

We are blessed here at Emanuel with a prayer chain ministry, with two chains, one by e-mail and one by phone. And we are (or we TRY to be) a connected, flexible series of closely linked and connected people used especially for holding others together and for transmitting the awesome power of prayer.

A recent article in *The Lutheran* expressed the caution of prayer chains and pastor’s announcements in respecting the HIPAA law for confidentiality. Mindful of this and of people’s personal preferences, we try to always ask for permission to publicly include any prayer requests, especially in terms of any specifics regarding state of health or medical condition, circumstances of request, etc. Prayer requests may be for church members, “extended family”, friends, neighbors, co-workers, the world at large— whoever or whatever is on anyone’s heart and mind to pray for!

As you can see, we have expenses 17% greater than our income for the first quarter. Our roof payment is most of the increase and the rest is the normal cost of living. We are at 25% of the budget spending for the 1st quarter and the offering is down 4% from the 1st quarter of 2005.

Giving toward the renovation loan has gone down a lot also.

We are trying to keep you informed. We all have had great increases this past year. We are praying to not have to cut any items and work within the budget that was approved for 2006.

That was also the year I started working as the secretary at Emanuel Lutheran Church. It seems like a lifetime...it seems like yesterday.
Our office technology advanced from an IBM Typewriter, carbon paper, stencils and mimeograph to a computer, laser printer, copier and digital duplicator.
The church building has gone through several major renovations. And we have bid farewell to 4 pastors, a Christian Education Director, a lay minister, and several interims.
Since May 1, 1976 we have witnessed 314 baptisms, 293 confirmations, 181 weddings, and 237 funerals. We've printed more than ½ million bulletins.
So many changes, so many new challenges. However, through all these years, one thing has always remained the same...God's love; it never changes.
Thank you for your recognition in church on April 30. The plaque hangs on my office wall. And Michael & I appreciate the dining gift certificates very much. Thanks also for the beautiful lap quilt, the flowers, cards and well wishes. I treasure them, and I treasure you.

Summer Sun Safety:

- During the sun's peak hours from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., seek out shade to avoid exposure.
- Use a broad spectrum sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or higher.
- Use clothing to cover your skin. Wear broad-brimmed hats and ultra violet blocking sunglasses.
- Avoid tanning parlors and other devices for artificial tanning.
- Make sure that you are following a healthy diet that provides you with Vitamin D safely.
- Always keep newborns out of the sun. Once the child is more than 6 months old sunscreens can be used.
- Make sure you teach your children sun-protective practices.
- Take time once a month to examine your skin from head to toe.
- Have a professional examination annually.

Avoid tanning, and especially sun burning. Remember that one blistering sunburn doubles your risk for melanoma.
