MY WALK IN FAITH

To begin thinking of writing my statement of faith caused my head to start spinning. To begin, I was brought up with a strong church background. My family were members at St. Augustine's here in Napoleon. Because of this, I naturally went to Parochial School for my first eight years. Growing up I developed a strong belief in my faith and actually considered religious training, not to become a priest, but to be a teaching brother. As I went on to Napoleon High School, I lost the thought of entering that profession. In retrospect, I think growing up in the Catholic Church made me feel guilty whenever I would miss going to church.

Well, time passed on and I attended college for a while. Then I ended up enlisting in the Army and spent 2½ years in the service. It was a great life experience for me, and probably helped me to mature a lot. However, during these years, I didn't attend church all that much, but still trusted that God would protect me.

With that phase of my life behind me, I knew that to continue with my college education was the right choice. Eventually, I met a wonderful

person and fell in love. Yes, Joyce and I were married and will be blessed with 35 years together this year. We were married at St. John's Lutheran. Less than a year later we found ourselves in Adrian to begin our lives together. Naturally, we felt we needed to find a church home. We found Hope Lutheran, where I received instructions, and we became members. It was then that I found a strong re-connection with my faith. We were blessed with two children and continued our life in Adrian and met some new friends while attending our new church home. We still have contact with some of them today. We moved to Hillsdale, MI in January of 1983 and spent about two years there until the job market turned bad. This opened the opportunity to move back to Napoleon for employment, because both of our families were still in the area. However, both of my parents died in 1985 prior to our move. This may have hastened our desire to come back to this area.

Another phase began with the move back to Napoleon. We joined the family here at Emanuel and have enjoyed being a part of this congregation. Our children have grown up and

are on their own and doing fine. I know for a fact that my faith in Christ has continued to grow during the last 35 years.

I am now in even another phase of life and my growth in faith with Christ. We recently experienced the birth of our first grandchild – Drew Alexander Brown – who was born to our daughter and son-in-law. What an awesome feeling!!! He excited all of us with his early arrival, but everything has been great. Friends have told us that the first grandchild would be the neatest experience and it truly has been. He

melts me every time I get a chance to hold him. This experience really helps your beliefs in God and that this world was created in His image.

I look forward to the next phase of my life in Christ and can say with certainty the future holds even brighter events for my life.

May the peace of God, the love of Christ, and the presence of the Holy Spirit be with us all.

Bloodmobile - 2008

Emanuel will sponsor its annual Bloodmobile on Monday, June 16, 2008 from 12:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. You are eligible to donate if your last donation was April 21. Our goal is 48 but I'm sure we can do better than that. If you've never donated before or it's been a long time since your last donation, please give this some consideration. You must be at least 17 years old and, of course, in good health. There is no upper age level. There are people in their 90's that are still donating blood.

Donating blood is safe and simple. The entire process takes about 45-60 minutes. Medical equipment is sterile, used only once, and then discarded. Please remember to eat healthy a week or so before you donate and make sure you drink plenty of water. Broccoli, bananas, raisins, and red meat are good sources of iron. When you donate for the first time, you will receive a card with your blood type on it.

This is a big undertaking for the church, and we do need your cooperation. There are people needed to unload the truck at around 11:00 a.m. and load back up between 6:30 - 7:00 p.m. Also needed are donor escorts, canteen workers and kitchen help. There will be signs posted for you to sign up. Please check the bulletin board by the office. If you wish to donate food or help in the kitchen, please contact Judy Hoffman at 419-748-8242. All others can contact me at 419-592-4606.

Please think about the list Pastor reads every week and consider donating.

Father’s Day

One Sunday in 1909, a young woman named Sonora Smart Dodd sat in a pew listening to a sermon honoring mothers. Her mother had died some years before, so her father had raised her by himself. She began to wonder why there wasn’t a day to honor fathers.

Sonora decided to arrange for a tribute to be paid to her father at a church in her hometown of Spokane, Washington. The date was June 19, 1910. Many believe that this was the beginning of Father’s Day.

Another view is that Dr. Robert Webb, pastor of Central Church, in Fairmont, West Virginia, held a service giving tribute to fathers in 1908. Regardless of which story is the correct one, it is certain that President Calvin Coolidge was the first president to choose a special day to honor fathers. He proclaimed the third Sunday in June as Father’s Day in 1924.
