There is a wonderful motion picture called "Places in the Heart." It takes place in the south during the depression. The town's sheriff is accidentally shot by a young, drunk black man. A mob of white people kill the young man and drag his body through town. The film becomes more complex when the sheriff's widow tries to make a go of farming cotton. She is eventually aided by a knowledgeable black drifter who shows up at her door one night asking for food.

I won't bore you with many more details, but the film deals with racism/sexism/honesty/loyalty/love/hate/hope, and finally ends with redemption.

The last scene in the film has all the characters sitting side by side in a church (even the ones who died), taking Holy Communion together. Murderer and victim, side by side sharing Christ's body and blood.

That film popped into my mind as I was thinking about our upcoming Lenten season.

We will begin on Ash Wednesday, sitting next to each other with all the baggage of our sins, eager to receive Holy Communion. The same bread, the same wine, the same Savior for all our many and various sins.

I encourage you to be there then and every Wednesday and Sunday to be strengthened by what unites us and gives us new life.

The divisions between us can then be seen in a different light and dealt with the loving Grace that through Jesus, God freely offers. That redemption is needed by us and the entire world.

Don't Give Up – Give More for Lent

Lent, the 40 days of self-examination and repentance before Easter, is a time for us to renew our relationship with God in Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to recognize God's abundance expressed in the sacrificial death of Jesus. As a common Lenten discipline, many Christians give up something during Lent. This giving up or fasting usually lasts for the six weeks until Easter.

This Lent, don't just give up something, but give more and share gifts of gratitude that express in a tangible way what God has done for you. What can you sacrifice for Lent and give to the ELCA World Hunger Appeal? Here are some ideas reflecting upon a few of the luxuries that we take so for granted in our everyday lives:

1 CD purchase = \$15
1 video rental per week: $\$3 \times 6 = \18
1 DVD purchase = \$20
1 snack per day: $60 \text{ cents} \times 40 = \24
1 soda/bottle of water per day: $\$1 \times 40 = \40
1 movie per week: $\$8 \times 6 = \48
1 tall vanilla latte per day: $\$3 \times 40 = \120
Dinner for two per week: $\$30 \times 6 = \180

P.S. The "goal" of the ELCA World Hunger Appeal is for every baptized member to give \$5 per year to the Hunger Appeal.

Trying to Quit Smoking? -by Candise Ankney

If you have been having difficulty in trying to quit, maybe it's time to try a different approach. Research has shown that using a nicotine patch for two weeks before trying to quit can double the chances of success. Some doctors advise against wearing a patch while smoking, but researchers have found no adverse effects during their trials.

Beginning nicotine patch treatment two weeks before the target quit smoking date doubled quit rates compared to starting treatment on the quit date. Cigarettes are less rewarding and less satisfying when there is already a level of nicotine in the system. Many of those who wore the patch before their target quit date smoked less than usual during that two week period, had fewer cravings, or more easily switched to a low tar/low nicotine cigarette. The patch also reduced withdrawal symptoms.

Currently, the label on nicotine patches advises against smoking while using the patch, until more studies can be done. Check with your physician if you are interested in quitting and would like to use a nicotine patch.

Are You at risk for colorectal cancer?

Starting at age 50, men and women who are at average risk of colorectal cancer should be screened regularly. Nearly 90 percent of all cases of colorectal cancer are diagnosed in people older than 50. Some men and women are at higher risk of the disease and may need to be tested earlier. Those at higher risk include:

People with a personal or family history of benign colorectal polyps.

People with a personal or family history of colorectal cancer.

People with a personal or family history of inflammatory bowel disease – ulcerative colitis or Crohn's.

Men and women who use tobacco, drink too much alcohol, are overweight or do not lead an active life.

African Americans appear to be at higher risk for the disease and are often diagnosed at a younger

age – they may need to begin screening at age 45.

March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month, founded by the Cancer Research and Prevention Foundation in collaboration with many partner organizations. Colorectal cancer is preventable, and is easy to treat and often curable when detected early. Talk with your health care professional about colorectal cancer today.
