At 87 my faith journey is approaching the end, whether it be a day, a week, a month or ten years from now – no, not an end, rather, a change! An unbelievable, surprising change, expressed so well in Natalie Sleeth's song, "Hymn of Promise":

"In the bulb there is a flower; in the seed, an apple tree,
In cocoons, a hidden promise: butterflies will soon be free!
In the cold an snow of winter there's a spring that waits to be
Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see...
In the end is our beginning; in our time, infinity;
In our doubt, there is believing; in our life, eternity.
In our death, a resurrection; at the last, a victory
Unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see."

Ans what a wonderful journey it has been! Being blest with Christian parents – and with two sets of Christian grandparents, as well! – I grew up in the church. So by the time I reached adulthood, the church and God's love was a natural way of life.

I must confess there were two exceptions. In college my church attendance was limited to singing in the church choir on Sunday morning. Then while hubby John was completing his navy hitch, we were in Washington, D.C., waiting assignment – his ship was torpedoed in the invasion of the Philippines. During this period of waiting, John had a duty schedule of "two days on, one day off". Since John was often on duty on Sunday and since we were expecting to leave the area at any moment, we were very negligent in our church involvement. In fact, I think the only time we even attended church was the one weekend my parents came to visit! The waiting ended up to be three months long, and John and I vowed then that such a lapse in our church involvement would never be repeated. And it wasn't!

My journey through this life has been such a blessing. John and his family were active church members, so he and I were in total agreement regarding church and the rearing of our children in the church.

I have had the opportunity of sharing the gift of music with so many others through teaching, choirs, both adult and children's, youth camps, senior citizen activities, etc. A great joy and blessing was working with and directing a

United Methodist Conference ministers' wives' choir for 26 years. It is my fervent hope that the 300 wives whose lives we touched, as well as the many, many listeners we had through the years, were made happier and more God-aware through the music we brought them!

Through all these years, the difficult times and the easy times, through joys and in sorrows, God's loving care has been a very real presence in my life. I can't begin to imagine what life would have been like without Him and His guidance!

One of the greatest blessings of all is the wonderful friends I have met along this journey

we call life. And you folks here at Emanuel are shining examples! You have welcomed me so warmly into your midst, making me feel so "at home". Thank you!

I conclude with the closing words of the hymn, "Great Is Thy Faithfulness". It puts into words the thought I would leave with you on your life's journey:

"Great is Thy faithfulness, great is Thy faithfulness,
Morning by morning new mercies I see;
All I have needed Thy hand hath provided,
Great is Thy faithfulness, Lord, unto me."
