The Mutual Relations Committee met on Monday, January 13, 2025. Attending were Pastor Janine, committee members Chelsey Saneholtz, Jeff Mires and Cheryl Huffman.

Pastor Janine opened the meeting with a prayer. There were no concerns brought to attention at this time. Then the committee reviewed the next chapter (Ministry Review) in Pastor and People. This chapter discussed the components of a review & evaluation including ministry goals, performance evaluation and planning for next year. Pastor Janine had shared that Emanuel had not done a ministry evaluation in the past, but staff evaluations are completed yearly. The book also had recommended the evaluation to be submitted to the church council and offered good examples of questions for the evaluations. Then Pastor Janine shared plans for future events including an event at the city pool in June, Easter sunrise at the river and working on values for the congregation. Also plans of a Thursday night service themed for "every day Saints" where a few people from the congregation can share their faith stories. Finally, the meeting was closed with a blessing by Pastor Janine.
